
## **Guidance Document**

## **Psychiatric Conditions**

When answering 'yes' to the psychiatric question on the medical declaration, a follow-on question will appear asking whether you would like to include or exclude the psychiatric condition:



Provided the psychiatric condition is not medically linked to any of the other pre-existing medical conditions declared, then the customer will have the option of either including or excluding it from the screening.

You should offer a quote with cover including psychiatric conditions in the first instance, by answering 'No' to the 'Would you like to exclude Psychiatric conditions?' question and screening the condition declared.

**Please note:** if you answer yes to 'Would you like to exclude Psychiatric conditions?' the only available scheme will be Ready2Go (AIG).

If offering the option to voluntarily exclude the psychiatric condition, please read the following declaration which appears when clicking on the help icon shown above:

Some insurers on our panel provide cover for psychiatric conditions, however others do class them as a general exclusion, therefore these would not be covered.

We can provide a quotation including or excluding these conditions or alternatively you can get a quotation for both.

If answering 'yes' to excluding psychiatric conditions, there is no need to screen the psychiatric condition.

Please note that if offering the option to exclude the psychiatric condition, you must advise customers that "any claims arising from or traceable to the psychiatric condition will be excluded from the cover but anything unforeseen will be covered".

Continue to the price delivery page which will show a list of insurers who are happy to provide cover but with the psychiatric conditions classed as a general exclusion (Currently only Ready2Go).
